



REGISTERING YOU'RE NEW BORN BABY IN SPAIN

By law you must register your baby within thirty days of the birth date. The hospital where you have your baby will provide the information necessary.

If you do not present the documents in time, the registration could take months as a report will be opened and you will have to accredit the reasons for not registering within the time specified.
